- The pedestrian gate in the Compound is not functioning properly. Getting outside is not an issue. The maintenance provider has been contacted and will be attending the issue as soon possible. In the meantime, please be patient and a kind reminder to not slam the door closed.
- The ramp gate locking system was modified without any discussion with the PIID. It appears that someone has flipped the locking mechanism upside down. This now exposes the padlock to the elements which will create more issues going forward (rust and water ingress). Should you have questions about infrastructure, please reach out to the PIID but do not take the initiative to modify systems on your own.
